

SVSG Case Management Report Analysis from April to June 2025.




Case Analysis over the past three months (April to June) has revealed varying trends in reported cases. The accompanying chart highlights a concerning rise in incest and rape cases involving children, primarily affecting female victims aged 4 to 15. These cases have been referred to the police and court for legal proceedings. Children who could not safely return home have been provided shelter at the SVSG Campus of Hope under interim protection orders (IPOs) issued by the court.

Gender-based violence (GBV) cases, affecting both women and men, have continued to be prevalent during this period. SVSG has responded to these cases through a range of services, including advocacy, counselling, psychosocial support, and referrals to the police, depending on the nature and severity of each case.

Child physical abuse accounted for 20% of cases reported to SVSG during this term. Additionally, cases involving extramarital affairs among young married individuals have continued to be observed as an ongoing social issue over the past three months.

Contributing Factors & SVSG Human Rights Watch.



SVSG Human Rights Watch:

In 2025, and especially during the three months from April to June, SVSG has witnessed an increase in child rights violations. The rising rates of rape and incest involving children not only breach relevant domestic laws but, more importantly, constitute serious violations of child rights as articulated in the Convention on the Rights of the Child (CRC). Article 34 of the CRC requires states parties to protect children from all forms of sexual exploitation and sexual abuse. Article 19 further outlines that every child has the right to proper care and protection from violence, abuse, and neglect.

Unfortunately, these rights have not been adequately protected by parents, family members, and guardians. As a state party to the Convention, the Samoan government is obligated to safeguard these children's rights. Child negligence and physical abuse have undermined children's rights to be nurtured and cared for in a safe environment. Parents and families are increasingly focused on earning money and attending to other matters, often at the expense of prioritizing their children's care.

Furthermore, the rights of women and of all individuals are being violated, particularly as social issues continue to affect family environments and contribute to the prevalence and consequences of violence. The increase of drug abuse as one contributing factor to the many cases of violence in SVSG is a serious threat to Samoa and the people's rights to safety, especially the vulnerable population of children, women and persons with disabilities.

SVSG 24/7 FREE Helpline Service

With cases that came through the Free Helpline, 40% of the calls were seeking online counselling and advisory enquiries to SVSG.



Persons with Disability

Within the past three months, some of the cases received through online calls involved persons with disabilities. These vulnerable individuals reached out to request an opportunity to live and be cared for within the SVSG campus. Some have also expressed concerns about the inadequate care they are receiving at home.



Marital Issues

Online cases were reported through the Free Helpline service, many of which involved marital disputes. These cases also contributed to incidents of violence against women and children.

Some women called seeking help on how to address and resolve family problems, particularly marital conflicts between couples



Female Callers

Most of the Helpline callers are female and are aged 25 and over. More than 50% of these women are mothers seeking online advice on how to care for their children and looking for help with their own challenges. Their problems include spouses leaving young mothers with their children, which can cause trauma when these mothers are unable to earn an income and care for their young children at the same time.

PARTNERSHIPS & DONATIONS

Australian High Commission Partners with SVSG in Developing Local Communities.

The rural villages of Siumu, Malaemalu, and Luatuanuu received direct support from the Australian High Commissioner to Samoa in April this year. This generous assistance included street lights, solar lights, sewing machines, and elei design materials, all aimed at enhancing community wellbeing and resilience.

World Book Day 2025 themed; 'Read Your Way from the Campus of Hope.'

Reading is fundamental to a child's development: it cultivates critical thinking, nurtures creativity, and fosters empathy. In celebration of World Book Day on April 23, 2025, UNESCO, in partnership with SVSG, donated books and reading materials to the children at the Campus of

Hope. The UNESCO staff in Apia also kindly volunteered their time to conduct one-on-one reading sessions with the children.

The children thoroughly enjoyed the reading experience and felt the care and support from the UNESCO colleagues who assisted them in their learning journey.



Tetaua Moana Navy New Zealand at the Campus of Hope

SVSG was grateful to receive generous donations of furniture from the Tetaua Moana Navy of New Zealand for the Campus of Hope this April. The visit was led by the New Zealand High Commissioner to Samoa, H.E. Sialei Van Tour, and Navy Commander Andrew Brown.

Men Advocacy Program Continues in April.

Another group of men referred from the Court in April continue to participate in counselling and anger management courses. These are typically first-time offenders. SVSG, in collaboration with the Police and Judiciary, supports this at-risk group through advocacy and counselling services.

These services aim to reduce violence and abuse within families by empowering and assisting men and husbands to safeguard their families from harm and social challenges.



SVSG Youth Empowered through Peer-to-Peer Training

In April, SVSG youth members participated in a peer-to-peer training aimed at equipping them to share important messages with fellow youth and young people. The training focused on helping youths support one another through one-on-one counselling and providing assistance to those in need, with the goal of preventing potential involvement in crime.

Dr. Jenevieve Manell, a long-standing SVSG partner from Australia, facilitated the training and provided SVSG juniors with valuable strategies for effectively engaging with other youth members.



SVSG Youth Joined Mangroves Cleaning Project.

In April, SVSG youth joined the Samoa National Youth Council (SNYC) for the Youth Mangrove Site Clean-Up project at the Moata'a Mangroves. The project aims to empower youth to take the lead in mitigating climate risks in Samoa and to advocate for mangrove conservation.

Through their participation and hands-on experience in cleaning the mangrove sites, the youth developed a greater interest in becoming climate change advocates for their communities and families.



SVSG In Partnership with Vodafone Samoa Launched the SVSG 20th Anniversary Press Conference.

Samoa Victim Support Group (SVSG) had the honour of meeting with Mrs. Shamil Nair-Bedouell, Director and UNESCO Representative to the Pacific, along with regional leads Susan Schneegans (Natural Science), Mary Anne Therese Manuson (Education), and Sara de Ugarte (Culture).

During the meeting, we discussed initiatives to highlight the importance of inclusive education, lifelong learning, STEM education, and the role of arts and culture in storytelling and advocacy for victims of violence and gender-based violence.

SVSG's grassroots work to protect the vulnerable, empower survivors, and restore hope closely aligns with UNESCO's mission to build peace through education, science, and culture. Together, we explored collaborative pathways to:

- Strengthen education for vulnerable groups
- Promote cultural resilience and traditional knowledge
- Support mental health and community healing
- Encourage youth empowerment and leadership



SVSG was Represented in the Pacific Technical Cooperation Session of the CEDAW Committee & CSO Action Planning Session Fiji.

The SVSG Communications Manager represented SVSG at the historic CEDAW session in Fiji in April 2025. This marked the first time the CEDAW Committee, which is usually based in Geneva, traveled to the Pacific region to conduct its reporting procedures for the three reporting island states of Fiji, Tuvalu, and the Solomon Islands. Samoa was represented by delegates from the Government MWCSD CEO and CSOs, who attended to learn from the procedures and better prepare for Samoa's upcoming CEDAW reporting. SVSG was also present to gain insight and prepare for its shadow submission in 2026.

Rather than viewing human rights solely from a universal perspective, the SVSG Human Rights Forum will focus on the experiences of marginalized victims and survivors of human rights violations in Samoa over the past two decades. The forum will be a platform to revisit and revitalize the emphasis on human rights through a bottom-to-top approach. Starting from the SVSG experience of the victims and the human rights violations they have experienced, and has significantly empowered the works of SVSG at the CSO level, and onwards to the national, regional and international level, the universal view of human rights.

that the work continues, that the mission still matters, and that the community is growing. You are part of something greater than any one person you are part of a legacy of love and protection.
